

How We Are Keeping You Safe



We understand that this is a stressful time for many families, so we have included our preventative steps on ensuring a safe environment for all campers and team members below.

Drop-off/Pick-up: A team member will be coming out to greet arriving campers in their cars. Upon arrival we will make sure you are registered, all paperwork is complete, and verify the campers' temperature is below 100.4 F / 38 C. Next, our team member will escort this camper into the building directly to our handwashing station before the start of their day.

Daily Schedule: We have structured our schedule to allow the campers to rotate in smaller groups between supervised play and crafts/activities. Additionally, we have made adjustments to include extra time for handwashing between rotations as well as disinfecting all high-contact areas. Teaching our campers proper hygiene methods (such as handwashing) will be crucial in controlling the spread of any germs.

Cleaning/Maintenance: Our entire facility is steam cleaned on a daily basis before opening. All tables, chairs, floors and play equipment are thoroughly disinfected prior to any customer arrivals. As previously stated, our camp schedule allows time for handwashing as well as disinfecting all high-contact areas.

Team Members: Daily temperature checks and questionnaire health screening will be required for all our staff. Additionally, each team member will be required to wear face covering throughout the day in addition to washing their hands at designated times (which are the same for our campers).



The health and safety of our guests and staff is our highest priority. Scramble is participating in the Alexandria Promise program run by the City of Alexandria in collaboration with the Health Department. This program is a voluntary certification program administered by the Alexandria Health Department to prepare for reopening. The Alexandria Promise shield indicates that Scramble has committed to higher safety standards for guests and employees above and beyond the minimum standards required by law. We are cleaning all high-touch surfaces frequently and have arranged our camp rooms to support social distancing. In accordance with Virginia guidance, all adults and children over 10 are required to wear face coverings.
